State of Iowa Administrator Reports (Blake DeRouchey)

911 Financials

- Quarterly surcharge disbursements
 - \$7,407,711.34 Surcharge revenue
 - \$1,387,064.36 Program expenses
 - \$4,444,626.80 Payments to PSAPs
 - \$1,412,422.25 Added to operating surplus
- End of year funds disbursed
 - \$6,903,516.70 (\$61,093.06 per PSAP)
- Operating Surplus
 - \$12,510,131.52 Total funds
 - \$9,010,131.52 Total available funds
 - Used for network merging, shared services, and pass through EOY 2019

Zetron Shared Services

Window 1: Upload July 1-Dec. 31

- 6 Counties (\$48,000) received first period grant funding in month one
 - Not eligible for second \$6,000 until January
- Many others just need to upload their data again (previous upload was prior to July 1)
- \$6,000 remains through Dec. 31 for counties who have not yet met benchmarks

Current Travel/Public Ed/Training Fund

- \$100,000 Annually (online application form)
- Expended: \$0
- Obligated/Approved: \$57,500
- Training tabled to approve: \$18,000

SWIC Chris Maiers gave the following update

- There are five new standards and six new users that will be before the ISICSB today. The standards include air ambulance landing zones and transports. If you have any questions on what is being published to the ISICSB website with regards to those standards or if you would like to participate, please let me know.
 - The Transport Standard is one that originated from several RIC meetings.
 - We had another Standards meeting on July 31. The next one is scheduled for Aug. 21.
- We have several training opportunities coming up with ISICS Regional Trainings in September, a couple of ICS-300 courses in October and November and Incident Tactical Dispatch. The details are forthcoming on Tactical Dispatch class and will be released once we have our scoping call.
- Work continues on the 2019 NECP. There has been a lot of focus on rural needs. Blake DeRouchev has been an active participant in those discussions.

- FirstNet/AT&T devices are now available for purchase under NPPGov contract. This gives Iowa agencies the ability to purchase devices and services under multiple different potential contracts—federal, NPPGov and State of Iowa.
