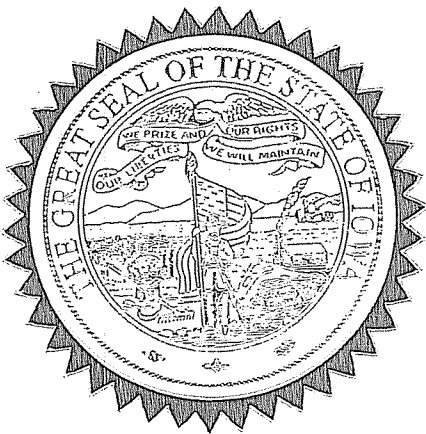

IN THE NAME AND BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE STATE OF IOWA

**PROCLAMATION OF DISASTER EMERGENCY**

- WHEREAS,** On Wednesday, May 25, 2011 releases from reservoirs on the upper Missouri River were increased due to above-normal snow in the mountains and extraordinary rain that occurred throughout the upper Missouri river basin; and
- WHEREAS,** historic flooding occurred as a result of those releases, causing significant economic impacts as well as damage to critical infrastructure and residential property; and
- WHEREAS,** infrastructure damage included damage to critical propane, gasoline, and diesel fuel supply lines and/or points, necessitating the August 26, 2011 Proclamation of Disaster Emergency relating to suspension of certain regulatory provisions for transportation of propane, gasoline or diesel fuel products; and
- WHEREAS,** surveys and reports forwarded by state and local officials indicate there is an ongoing need for state assistance to respond to and recover from the effects of this flood and that disruptions to the supply and shortages of gasoline and diesel fuel detailed in said proclamation are continuing; and
- WHEREAS,** strict compliance with the hours of service requirements of section 321.449 of the Iowa Code will continue to prevent, hinder or delay timely delivery of gasoline and diesel fuel critical to Iowa farm and other industry and the general public.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I,** Terry E. Branstad, Governor of the State of Iowa, by the power and authority invested in me by the Constitution, Article IV Sections 1 and 8 and Iowa Code section 29C.6(1), do hereby proclaim the state of disaster emergency to be extended until November 23, 2011, for the above mentioned reasons, and extend suspension of the regulatory provisions of Iowa Code 321 section 449 pertaining to hours of service of motor carriers and drivers of commercial motor vehicles while transporting gasoline or diesel fuel products until November 23, 2011. All conditions, limitations, restrictions, and requirements of the Proclamation of Disaster Emergency issued August 26, 2011, shall continue to apply.
